The School Board approved the following personnel appointments, pending background check and fingerprinting, as applicable:

Mr. Adam Letizia has been appointed as the Director of Instruction & Student Support Services for the 2020-2021 school year. Letizia taught special education and social science, and he served as Coordinator of the Alternative Education Program at NHS. Currently Letizia serves as the Director of Special Education and Student Support Services (2017-present). Health update:

Superintendent **Dr. Holly Wargo** shared information regarding the COVID-19 concern. The school division is partnering with the Virginia Department of Education, the Virginia Department of Health, and the Centers for Disease Control to implement guidance for COVID-19 prevention. Specifically Wargo outlined **steps students and families may take to help prevent illness** including

- Washing your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Not touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Covering your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Taking flu antivirals if prescribed by your healthcare provider if you have the flu.
- Avoiding close contact with people who are sick.
- Staying home when you are sick.
- Cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched objects and surfaces.

NCPS is working on a division calendar plan for makeup time in the event schools across the Commonwealth are required to close for a period of time.

Recruiting update:
